Penelope Mills holds a Master of Music in Operatic Performance from the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester UK, a BMusEd (Hons) from the Sydney Conservatorium and has been awarded both an AMusA and LTCL in Vocal Performance. Whilst in the UK, she won the D’Oyly Carte Charitable Trust Scholarship and the RNCM’s Stuart Grey Scholarship and was a finalist in the Elizabeth Harwood Prize.

Penelope performs extensively with Australia’s leading orchestras and choirs including the Sydney, Melbourne, Queensland, West Australian and Tasmanian Symphony Orchestras, Sydney Philharmonia Choirs and Orchestra, Sydney Chamber Choir, Royal Melbourne Philharmonic, Sydney Concert Orchestra and Sydney Soloists.

Penelope’s vast range of concert repertoire has led to engagements in Australia, the USA and the UK. Her repertoire includes Bach *B Minor Mass* and *St John Passion*, Handel *Messiah*, Rutter *Requiem*, Fauré *Requiem*, Vaughan Williams *Pilgrim’s Journey* and *Dona Nobis Pacem*, Mozart *Mass in C*, CPE Bach *Magnificat*, Pergolesi *Stabat Mater*, Vivaldi *Gloria*, Beethoven *Symphony No. 9* and *Choral Fantasia*, Haydn *Mass in Time of War*, Poulenc *Gloria* and Vaughan Williams’ *Sinfonia Antartica* with the Sydney Symphony in the Sydney Opera House Concert Hall.

In 2006 Penelope made her American debut in a recital of operatic arias for Washington Concert Opera in Washington D.C. That same year, she made her debut with the Sydney Symphony in Puccini’s *La Rondine*. Following a successful season as Fiordiligi in Pacific Opera’s *Così fan tutte*, Penelope sang a critically acclaimed Elettra in Mozart’s *Idomeneo* for Pinchgut Opera. For Pinchgut she has also sung Euridice in Monteverdi’s *L’Orfeo*, and Vénus in Rameau’s *Dardanus*. Other operatic roles include Gretel (*Hansel and Gretel*) and First Lady (*The Magic Flute*) for Pacific Opera, Tatyana (*Onegin*, Stowe Opera, UK), and Zweite Dame (*Die Zauberflöte*), Susanna (*Le Nozze di Figaro*), Zerlina (*Don Giovanni*) and Nedda (*I Pagliacci*).

With an interest in new music, Penelope has given several Australian and World premiere performances. In 2008, she performed Gordon Kerry’s new completion of Mozart *Requiem* with the Sydney Chamber Choir. Other premieres include Ib Norholm’s *Impressions of the Little Mermaid* for the Sydney Festival, works by the Finnish composer Kaija Saariaho with The

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Seymour Group and *The Earth that Fire Touches* by Australian composer John Peterson, for the Sydney Philharmonia Choirs at City Recital Hall, Angel Place.

In addition to several solo recitals, other recent engagements in Australia include Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, Mahler *Symphony No. 4*, *Carmina Burana*, performing with the Sydney Philharmonia, Sydney Soloists, Canberra Choral Society and the Sydney Mozart Society.

2009 sees Penelope debut with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra for Beethoven *Symphony no. 9* and with the West Australian Symphony Orchestra for Mozart's *Requiem*. She will sing Haydn Creation with the Sydney Philharmonia Choirs, give lieder recitals and also appear with the Brisbane, Blue Mountains and Castlemaine Festivals. Penelope will open the MSO season with Mahler *Symphony no. 2* and she returns to Sydney Symphony to sing Mendelssohn's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, under the baton of Maestro Ashkenazy.
